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APPRENTICESHIP

Apprenticeship is a unique opportunity that combines classroom and handson training with on-the-job experience. Apprentices earn a livable wage while they learn. Through on-going training, they add to their employability and knowledge.

CAREER & ADVANCEMENT POTENTIAL

Contractors know Apprentices learn about the big picture and develop trade-related skills during their Apprenticeship. Contractors want their workforce to be technically skilled, diversified, and have advancement potential. They are willing to pay top dollar for these workers.

Contractors seek Apprentices and apprentice-trained, journey-level workers for supervisory jobs, estimators and junior partners.

Upon completion of the Apprenticeship, 39 credits are earned within the Wisconsin Technical College System towards the Technical Studies – Journeyworker Applied Associates Degree (10-499-5).

BENEFITS

Benefits may include health insurance, pension contributions, training and vacation funds. Veterans may also be eligible to collect their GI Bill benefits while going through their Apprenticeship.

While you are an Apprentice, you may have the opportunity to work for more than one employer to develop different skills and choose the type of work you like best.

EARN WHILE YOU LEARN

There is no cost to the apprenticeship program for members.

- 1st Year Apprentice @ 60% of journey-level rate: Earned: \$42,540*
- 2nd Year Apprentice @70% of journey-level rate: Earned: \$49,640*
- 3rd Year Apprentice @ 80% of journey-level rate: Earned: \$56,720*
- 4th Year Apprentice @ 90% of journey-level rate: Earned: \$63,820*
- Total wages earned during four-year Apprenticeship: \$212,720*

The Apprenticeship Program takes about four years, with a minimum of 5,840 paid hours of work experience and 560 hours of schooling.

SELECT AN APPRENTICESHIP

Carpenters build all types of structures from office buildings to sports stadiums.

Floor Coverers install carpet, vinyl, cork, laminate and hardwood on floors and walls.

Millwrights install, repair and maintain machinery in all types of industrial applications.

Heavy Highway Pile Drivers install deep foundations and erect concrete structures including buildings, dams, and bridges.

REQUIREMENTS

- Must be 18 years of age
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent (GED/HSED).
- Have a valid driver's license or consistent means of transportation.
- ACT Math score of 15 (within last 5 yrs) OR Next Generation Accuplacer score of 237 (within last 5 yrs) OR pass the local math assessment

YOUR NEXT STEPS

- Contact the nearest Training Center to provide ACT or Next Gen score OR make an appointment for testing.
- Once you provide the documentation to the Training Center and meet the requirements, your Joint Apprenticeship Committee will provide you with instructions on how to proceed.
- 3. Locate an employer to hire you as an Apprentice. We can help with this!
- Meet the Joint Apprenticeship Committee where you will sign your Apprentice Contract with the State of Wisconsin, Bureau of Apprenticeship Standards.
- 5. Begin work and school as soon as scheduled for you.
